Chris & Angie Walker Papua New Guinea

Chris and Angie Walker and their two boys, Titus and Baruch, are serving the Lord in Papua New Guinea; located in the southwestern Pacific. The Walker's share an urgent prayer request for the people of Mibu, whom they minister to.

Several months ago, the Leighton Church family was praying for this region as the people were being attacked by a group called the Headwater Gang. The Gang has ramped up activity again. It is election time in Papua New Guinea and the Headwater Gang has threatened to disrupt the election process for their district.

On Wednesday, July 6th, the Headwater Gang attacked a village in Nankina, specifically targeting another missionary translation office/helper's house (from another organization-missionaries are not onsite). Reports are that the radio and equipment has been damaged, the translation helper's daughter raped and possibly taken into captivity, and the helper himself injured or worse. There are rumors circulating that the gang is threatening to attack targets much closer to Mibu this weekend. Pray for protection for the people and for peace in this land. May the Headwater Gang be overcome with the Holy Spirit and turn from their evil ways.

The Walker's also share an update on the family. On June 10th, Titus and Baruch finished school locally in Michigan as the family had been in the U.S. taking care of personal matters after Chris' identity had been stolen. On June 12th, Chris, Titus and Baruch traveled back to Papua New Guinea. Angie had started the online portion of the final level of training for Educational Therapy a few weeks earlier. On June 19th, Angie traveled to Idaho for a week of residency training. Last week, Angie boarded a series of 6 flights to join the family in Papua New Guinea. It was a bit stressful with cancelled flights, super tight connections, delayed flights, and in the end—lost luggage. They are all thankful to be back in the country where their heart is, preparing to jump in to the full routine of their ministries.

Please Pray:

- For Angie's back to find their way to her
- For the Defense Force to be able to follow through on their promise of going interior to protect the election process and potentially defuse gang acitivity
- God will once again show himself strong on behalf of the Mibu church and the gang's attempts at an attack on Mibu-land will be symied, confused and blocked.

With the recent Supreme Court ruling overturning Roe v. Wade, what does this mean for the state of Michigan?

Resources from the Pregnancy Resource Center and Grand Rapids Right to Life share the following:

In 1846, a law was passed in Michigan banning all abortions with the exception of the "life of mother." This decision was challenged in 1931 and 1973 and upheld both times by Michigan's Supreme Court. Currently, Governor Whitmer has filed a suit in the Michigan Supreme Court saying this law is unconstitutional. Planned Parenthood has a petition drive going on trying to collect 425,000 good signatures by July 11th to allow voters to vote on this at the upcoming election.

If this amendment is successful, state laws that could be overturned include the ban on tax-funded abortions, the Partial-Birth Abortion Ban, the Born Alive Infant Protection Act, the parental consent requirement for children seeking abortions, the waiting periods and informed consent requirements for women seeking abortions, the licensing and health and safety regulations for abortion facilities and Michigan's ban which was passed in 1846, slightly revised in 1931 and affirmed by Michigan voters in 1972.
