

Teacher at Rift Valley Academy Kenya, Africa

Amy Galloway has completed her first year of teaching science courses at Rift Valley Academy, a boarding school for missionary kids. In her recent newsletter, Amy says, "I have the best job in the world." What makes her say that? Is there a particular course she enjoys teaching more than others? No. It is the students that fill her classes that make her job the best in the world.

Amy was recently asked to be the adult chaperone for a group of girls going camping. Students are allowed to camp in the woods just on the other side of the fence, but if it's a group of all ladies, or a mixed gender group of students, they need an adult chaperone. Since there are strict COVID protocols in place there, sleeping in tents was not an option; so hammocks and open air it was. Amy and 6 girls had an amazing time bonding with one another during this trip. Sitting around the campfire, the girls ask Amy, "What is your story?" After Amy shared her story of the Lord's kindness and grace in bringing her to Rift Valley Academy, Amy asked the girls to share. Most of the girls' parents are missionaries in the same part of Mozambique. The girls share about the difficulty of transitioning from Mozambique, back to the U.S., and back to Rift Valley Academy; how hard it is for each relationships to shift right as they are finally feeling like they are part of them and how that has taught her to rely heavily on Jesus.

Amy also shared about two tall, lanky Kenya guys who were in her Chemistry class. These two guys indicated that Amy invites the girls to her house for dinner, but never the guys. So Amy cooked them a lasagna dinner and set-up the usual COVID friendly spot, outside on her front porch overlooking her open yard where the sun sets just over the hedge. Amy prepared a feast anticipating these two young men would bring friends along. No, it was just them and they ate it all! During their small talk, one of the boys asked Amy, "How'd you end up in Kenya?" She shared the long version of her story, at their request, and as she shared, the eyes of one of the young men lit up; not the usual eyelid droop she sees from him during Chemistry class. After Amy finished telling her story, he replied, "Wow! Sometimes I wonder how God just talks to people like that. I want him to talk to me like that."

This is what it's about. Creating relationships with other people, learning what their story is, and sharing how God has and is working in your life.

Pray for Amy as she is between school years that she will have a restful and meaningful time with family and friends while she is in the U.S. for a couple of weeks. Pray for her as she prepares for another school year.

Food for Thought from Pastor Dave Mesiter

Every now and then, I come across a really good article that I would like to pass on to each of you. Scott Reeve from "Today's Insights" has shared such an article. Enjoy!

How We Can B.L.E.S.S. Others

For the historic Christian faith, Jesus' resurrection is crucial to what we believe and how we live. Because what we believe influences how we live, I would like to share some practical thoughts about how we can live and, hopefully, make a difference in our corner of the world.

I would like to talk about how we B.L.E.S.S. others. The first letter, "**B**", means "**Be in Prayer.**" Being our days asking God to use us as he sees fit. Be open to His leading. Ask God for those "God appointments" in which we have the opportunity to be a blessing to others. Colossians 4:2-6 tells us how Paul prayed for openings to share the Good News about Jesus to others.

The letter "L" means "Listen". We need to have discerning ears. Some people mask things. We have to be able to discern what people might be saying. There are also those casual conversations God brings our way every day. We need to show people they matter, that what they have to say does count. Listening is a powerful too God uses. James 1:19 tells us to be "quick to hear, slow to speak…" Listening has the idea of more than just hearing words. It is trying to understand what someone is saying, asking questions, getting input. Listening requires a willingness to care and get the information right. Be involved in the lives of others. Show that you care.

The third letter, "**E**", means "**Engage**". To live out God's mission in the world, we must be around people. I need to be around people so when opportunities do arise, when God allows it to happen, I can share the salvation message with others. It also entails being genuine and friendly to people, whether I get the change to talk about Jesus or not. Not every opportunity allows that to happen, but I can still engage with them, being gracious and kind.

The fourth letter, the first "**S**" tells us of our need to **Serve**. Jesus said in Mark 10:45 that he had not come to Earth to be served, but to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for all. Matthew 9:35-38 is a reminder of Jesus' mindset that I must have also when it comes to serving. In this passage, he is proclaiming the Good News of salvation and doing ministry. Verse 36 tells us as he looked at the crowds, he was moved with compassion. The Lord saw the need of the people. But more than seeing them, he also did what he could to help. Compassion is tied to action. When it comes to knowing who we can serve, here is a thought that can guide us: Who are we interacting with? Who is in front of us, if we could put it that way? Serving can happen right where we are. There are opportunities to serve in our neighborhoods...in our communities and in our churches. At times our serving is personal. We get to know people, their pain, joys, etc. This is not always the case, but there are those serving "moments" when we get to know a little more about those we are reaching out to.

Our final letter, another "**S**" is tied to being prepared to **share our Story**. As a follower of Christ, I want to be able to tell others in 2 to 3 minutes what God has done in my life. We never know when those times may happen; when someone asks us a question about our belief in God and in Jesus Christ our Lord. We may also be asked by some to share our story. It is good to be prepared, to have it ready to go when those God "moments" come along.

B.L.E.S.S. others. That should be the forefront of all who claim Christ as their Lord and Savior.
