

Those age 50+ are invited to gather for lunch the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month at 1:00pm at an area restaurant.


March Luncheon: March 16th at 1:00 p.m. Curley Cone, 12850 W. M-179 Hwy, Wayland

Kids & Youth Musical Practice Underway It's not too late to join!


It's "Amazing Grace" and it's a musical for kids and youth from ages 5 to 18.

Shad & Sarah Deal Braden & Brice Ethnos360

In their most recent newsletter the Deal's share this as written by Sarah:

"It was just an average Thursday night. Shad and I were finishing up the most recent season of 'The Chosen'... The particularly emotional, one hour long episode ended with Peter sobbing and clinging to Jesus, and we sat together in silence for a moment, me still sniffling. Shad broke the silence with a comment: 'Well, that was the most intense one yet!' With that the silence continued as we both began to drift into the next tasks on our to do list for the evening.

Within minutes the silence was broken by a familiar, low cry. I loved over at Shad, whose face was contorted as his cry became slowly louder and his hand began to curl inward. Yes, this was heartbreakingly familiar. I sat beside him as his body crumpled awkwardly, not knowing how to make him more comfortable. I left him for just a moment to grab my phone and call a neighbor. Within a few more seconds, his lips were blue, eyes rolled back. It has been five years, four months since Shad's brain surgery in September 2017. Since that day he came out of the second surgery, when they removed the left temporal lobe and with it seizure focus, he had been seizure free. We celebrate it every year.

But in one night, God chose to start the clock over again for him. For us. It's been a grieving process deep and profound. Ten days later, another seizure rocked Shad's brain, leaving us reeling again.

Where does this leave our future plans? Our plan is to resign from Ethnos360 Training at the beginning of June and from Ethnos360 as a whole by the end of August. Due to the recent seizure activity, we have decided to extend our timeline by one month."

Continue to pray for Shad and Sarah during this difficult time; asking for God to surround them with His peace, give them guidance and direction for their future, and wisdom and discernment as parents of teenagers.

With Shad & Sarah's resignation from Ethnos360 coming this year, Leighton Church is no longer financially supporting them, but we continue to support them in prayer and love.

Celebrating 160 Years of Proclaiming New Life in Jesus Christ 1863-2023

2023 is the 160th Anniversary of Leighton Church. Several people are attending Leighton Church now that were not here 10 years ago for our 150th celebrations which included year-long, weekly oral presentations of church history. Therefore, this year we will be having historical reports printed in the weekly news bulletin to inform (or remind) people of our church's beginnings and events.

WHO WE WERE—WHO WE ARE: A FAITH JOURNEY—Part 10

When the first church building on the corner of 2nd and 142nd was reconstructed in 1910-1911 there were several changes. The cloakroom, the bell tower, and the two entrances were completely removed and the sanctuary was extended to the east. A wing was added to the south side of the sanctuary and a bell tower was built at the south-east corner of the sanctuary. The new entrance was located in the lower part of the bell tower. All the window panes were stained glass. Tan brick had been used for the exterior of the original church and that same kind of tan brick was used in the reconstruction.

The new south wing was separated from the sanctuary by a partition which could be rolled up or down. This wing provided extra seating space for overflow crowds as well as for extra Sunday School classes. It was also used for meetings of church organizations during the week. A stove was used for auxiliary heat so it was no longer necessary to heat the entire building when small groups were meeting. The main heating plant was a one register furnace.

In the original building, light had been provided by kerosene lamps that were in wall brackets throughout the sanctuary. With the reconstruction, a new carbide lighting system was installed. This new system provided a much brighter light than kerosene lamps. It cost \$15.84 the first year to operate. This included having the carbide shipped to Moline.

After several years, this indoor lighting system became dangerous. In very cold weather, the water in the carbide would freeze which could be hazardous. So it was decided to install an outdoor system. A much larger tank was used and buried in the ground deeply enough that the water in the carbide would not freeze. This larger system was more economical because carbide could be purchased in larger quantities and at a lower price. There was less freight charge and there was no longer a need to keep a fire in the furnace to prevent the freezing of the carbide. The new plant could be purchased at cost which was \$197.00 including installation.

A special meeting of the congregation was held on January 28, 1913, to present the final statement of the reconstruction cost. The total cost was \$3,653.69. It was all completely paid and even had a balance of \$92.73! In spite of all the confusion, inconveniences and pressures created by the building project, all the regular services and activities of the church had continued. This was a great accomplishment and **another example** of God's faithfulness to His people and their faithfulness to Him.
