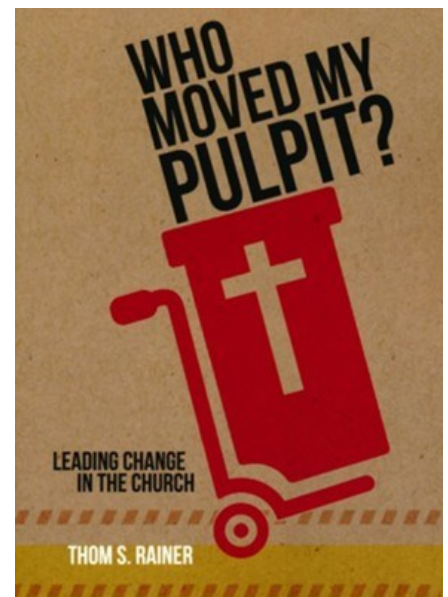
"Who Moved My Pulpit?"

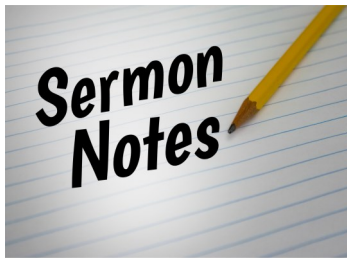

After awhile, you'll discover how much you've learned about God and how the Bible is important in developing a relationship with Him.

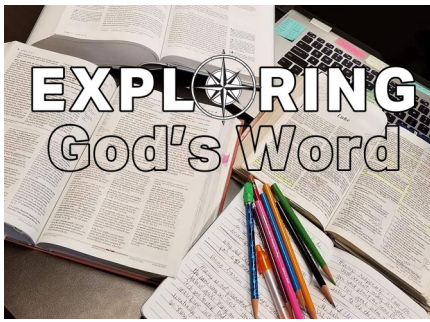


Kids age 4 thru 2nd Grade will gather in the **gym** for Children's Church immediately following the Children's Message.

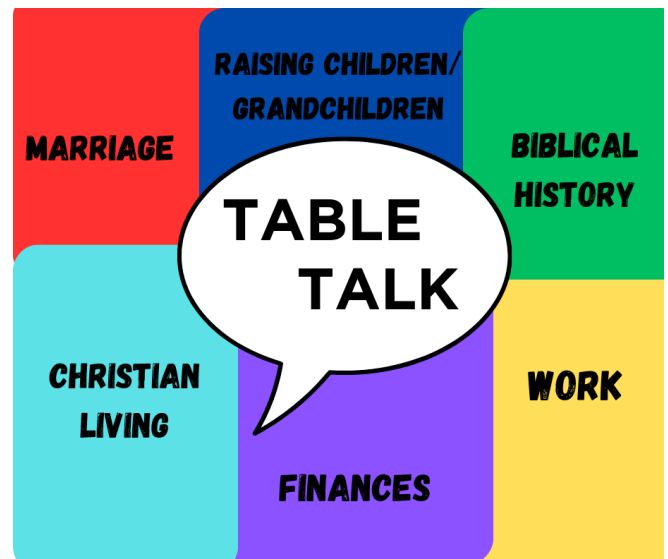

Charlotte, Selma
Zimbabwe, Africa**

In August, the Kuhudzayi Family visited Leighton Church. It was our first visit with them and it was a joy getting to know them and learn more about their ministry in Zimbabwe, Africa. Their ministry focuses on improving the quality of life in southern Africa through agriculture and building the Kingdom by walking alongside people and deepening faith.

During their visit to Leighton in August, the Kuhudzayi's indicated that they had their eye on a 35-acre plot of land in the Matobo District to set up a permanent place to base their ministry. In their recent newsletter the Kuhudzayi's write:

"Since landing back in Zimbabwe on August 26th, we received enough partnership and contributions to put forth an offer for a sale agreement on the 35-acre plot in Matobo District. This was a huge step forward and we were so excited to finally have a permanent place to base our ministry and family, and be able to establish roots in the community and engage them in ways that will share the gospel.

Very shortly after moving all production materials and projects to the plot, we were evicted from the land by a man claiming to be the rightful owner of the land and the police were of no assistance. The money we paid for the land will be reimbursed and we were able to move 90% of the equipment and project assets off. For context, land can be a very contentious and disorganized issue in a former colony like Zimbabwe. Add the difficulty of the economic situation and things can be disorderly to say the least.

The Kuhudzayi's will base their projects close to where they lived last year. They will continue to rent the house they are in and take advantage of the opportunities and relationships they already have here. Continue to pray for them and where God plans for them to base their ministry.

Stop by the Christmas tree in the Lobby and select a tag listing a suggested toy to purchase or pick up a toy/gift of your choosing.

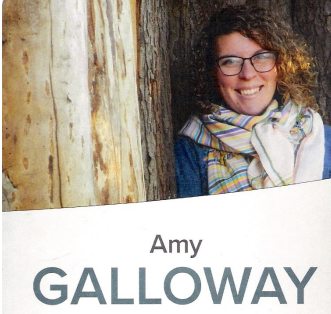

Celebrating 160 Years of Proclaiming New Life in Jesus Christ 1863-2023



2023 is the 160th Anniversary of Leighton Church. Several people are attending Leighton Church now that were not here 10 years ago for our 150th celebrations which included year-long, weekly oral presentations of church history. Therefore, this year we will be having historical reports printed in the weekly news bulletin to inform (or remind) people of our church's beginnings and events.

WHO WE WERE—WHO WE ARE: A FAITH JOURNEY: Part 45

Sports:

People of Leighton church have had a strong interest in playing sports for at least 100 years and perhaps longer. The first record we have is the 1923—1927 baseball team. They played on a league for 5 years.

As the years passed, softball replaced baseball. One team, which was organized around 1940 and continued to play together until the early 1950's, won the **Championship** of the Woodland Softball League in 1947.

Basketball teams were not organized at Leighton until after the Parish House was built in 1947. This building gave young people the opportunity to organize a team and to compete against other teams that also were usually church teams. The games were most always played in Leighton's Parish House because very few other churches had an appropriate facility or gym to use. There is a basketball uniform and warm-up sweatshirt on display in the historical cabinet in the narthex. It belonged to Theron Thaler, Doug's father.

There were other teams off and on through the years. Leighton had a Blooper Ball team that played at the Moline fields on Monday nights against other church teams. If the kids would chase down the foul balls and home run balls, they would be given a free candy bar. Blooper ball was played like slow-pitch softball except only two gloves were allowed—shortstop and first base.

Leighton had a volleyball team in the 1990's which played games at Kentwood Community Church. Some of the members of this team were: Stacey Steeby, Shawn Eaton, Mark Kaechele, Colin Mead, Keith Pratt, Mark Schiefla, and Jean Bender. Bill Aman played on the Kentwood Community team so volleyball may have played a part in his and Stacey's future marriage! This volleyball team is also where Mark Kaechele met Ronda who is now his wife!

In 1991 there was a Leighton men's softball team and a co-ed softball team. Some members on the men's team were: Shawn Eaton, Mike Shanahan, Doug Thaler, and Keith Pratt. Some members of the co-ed team were: Cindy Herring, Chris Herring, Shawn Eaton, Keith Pratt, Stacey Steeby, and Mike Shanahan.

In 2013, there were 2 co-ed softball teams. Team #1 had Keith Pratt (coach), Stacey Aman, and Doug Thaler among many others. Mike Lepeak was coach for Team #2 and Loyd Elwood with several others were on that team.

Have you seen the little building near the ball field and play ground? That is the ice cream shack which was built by Art Hooker. Players and spectators alike, enjoyed the ice cream served by Art and Connie Hooker during softball games.

Archery is another sport enjoyed at Leighton. In 2002, adult archery began on Thursday evenings during January-March and during those same months, youth archery on Saturday mornings. Then in 2009, breakfast was offered on Saturday mornings for all ages with youth archery following. The Saturday breakfasts and youth archery continue to date.
