Before You Speak

Use these five filters to examine your words before you speak-especially in times of tension or conflict:

T-Is it TRUE? Are my words grounded in truth, or are they based on assumptions, gossip, or half-truths? (*Ephesians 4:25– Speak the truth in love...."*)

H- Is it HELPFUL? Will this contribute to the growth, healing, or clarity of the situation?

I— Is it INSPIRING? Do my words build up others and reflect Christ's heart, or do they tear down? (Ephesians 4:29- "Only what is helpful for building others up.... That it may benefit those who listen.")

N— Is it NECESSARY? Is this the right time to say this? Does this need to be said, or should I wait and pray? Am I encouraging people to talk with each other or am I meddling or speaking negatively just because I can.

K- Is it KIND? Are my words marked by gentleness, compassion, and humility?

(Proverbs 15:1—"A gentle answer turns away wrath....")

Matthew 18: 15-17

Jesus' Steps for Restoring Relationships with Grace and Truth

Conflict is inevitable—but bitterness isn't. Jesus outlines a clear, restorative path for dealing with personal offenses.

1. Go Privately

"If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone...."

- -Matthew 18:15
- No gossip. No group texts. Just honest, loving conversation. It should be a direct and detailed interaction addressing the heart of the issue.

2. Take One or Two Others

"But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you...."

- -Matthew 18:16
- Being wise, neutral believers to help restore— not necessarily escalate.

3. Bring it to the Church

"If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church...."

- -Matthew 18:17
- Involve spiritual leadership when necessary, with the goal of reconciliation.

Final Thought: "Let all that you do be done in love." 1 Corinthians 16:14

The goal of every conversation is to not win an argument, but to win a brother or sister back and glorify God.

Update on Operation Christmas Child

I was hoping to bring you more exciting news, but unfortunately, I have shingles on my face and by my eye that is causing excessive pain. To all those helping with shoebox projects, there will be a pause in getting more supplies to you until I am able to get more together when I am feeling better.

What can you do until God has restored my health? There are lots of yard sales this time of year. Please look for kids' toys still in the packaging from fast food kids' meals. Ask about t-shirts to use for jump ropes. Look for small tote bags that will fold up small. Sometimes you can find a lot of new things at garage sales and when you tell them about a shoebox and how it is used to tell kids about Jesus, they will give you items for free!

Not sure what can and what cannot go into a shoebox? Stop by the display table in the Lobby for a list of items suggested by Samaritan's Purse. You can also find this list online at https://www.samaritanspurse.org/operation-christmas-child/what-goes-in-my-shoebox-suggestions/

Other sources are Dollar Tree or Amazon. I have a gift list on Amazon.com Just search for my name (Patty Hoekstra) under Amazon lists. The list title is OCC Shoeboxes.

Items needed are: toothbrushes (not pre-pasted), boxes of 24 crayons, single subject notebooks, kids' silverware (IKEA has 6 packs for a good price), 6" rulers, kids scissors, and zippered pencil pouches. School sales will start soon so keep an eye out for these items!

Any questions, please reach out to me. It might take a little longer for me to respond, but I promise I will. Please say a prayer for my husband, Wayne. He is a champ when things happen, but he is lost because he knows I usually deal with pain and this is a whole new level for us to deal with.

Amy Galloway Kenya, Africa



Amy Galloway lives in Kijabe, Kenya where she serves as a missionary and educator at Rift Valley Academy. She teaches Chemistry, AP Chemistry, AP Calculus, and a class called "Comparative Religions: Islam and the Christian Response." Working at a boarding school Amy has the opportunity to walk alongside her students and point them toward Christ in every aspect of life, not just in the classroom.

Amy feels there is something deeply special about the Rift Valley Academy community. They all live closely-sharing life, ministry, laughter, and even the hard moments. Recently, that closeness has shone through as people that have no time in their schedule still carve out time to help one-another in a time of need.

Amy was in need herself a couple weeks ago when she came home to an isolated power outage and sewage overflowing out of the culverts built into her front porch. When she called the maintenance on call number, five different men were at her home within minutes, lifting sewer covers, opening electrical boxes and testing them, breakers were flipped, and more. Then a ladder appeared, men climbed up to the electrical lines, and a metal rod was stuck through the culvert as a snake to break up the buildup on blockage. After assessing how bad the outage was with the neighbors, monkeys were finally to blame for the disconnected wire. After all that, the problem was still not fixed! Another hour of hard labor, the clog cleared up and began to drain.

The next week, Amy was able to give back to her community by setting up a meal train for several different families in need. Yet, despite the overwhelming number of requests for meals, every slot was filled. Meals were delivered, classes were covered, and the community showed up to help one another.

Lately, it has been exhausting for the community at Rift Valley Academy. Please join them in prayer:

For health— especially for our youngest community members and those recovering from illness.

For rest and strength— for those who are giving so much to hold up others.

For the students— that they would feel supported during this full season.

For continued willingness- that God would stir generosity in those who have the space to give.
