I know everyone has begun hearing more about restructures and things of that sort related to the church. The biggest focus right now is moving forward to begin the search for an additional full time associate level pastor to assist in the ministry endeavors of the church. For the last month, several elders have begun calling people from within our personal networks to see if there are possible candidates that are both qualified and interested in applying to such a role. Additionally, we are addressing the financial feasibility of the role so we may best understand how this impacts our budget and allow us to communicate better with the prospective candidates that will be brought before the church. At this time, no agreement has been made with Shepherd's Staff to assist in the search though that may be a future possibility.

You can do just that on Tuesdays from 2:00-3:00 p.m. Pastor Dennis' office is open to anyone who would like to come in and talk. No appointment needed!



Pastor Dennis.



Can you give a bit of your time?

Is God calling you to get more involved in the ministry of the church? There are several opportunities where you can volunteer. Some of these ministries may take 15 minutes a week, others will require more time. Will you pray to see if God's speaking to you to serve Him in a new way?

Nursery Coordinator – while we don't have many children utilizing the nursery in recent weeks, the nursery needs to be staffed and ready for when children do come. This position involves creating a schedule for nursery workers, ensuring the toys and furniture are clean, and stocking the nursery with snacks/diapers, etc (which is reimbursable).

Children's Church Coordinator – Children's Church is for kids age 4 thru 2nd grade. This role involves creating a teacher/helper schedule for each week and seeing that curriculum and materials are available and ready.

Kids Activity Sacks – Sacks filled with coloring pages, small toys, and books are available at the Sanctuary main entrance for kids to take and enjoy during the service. Someone is needed to re-stock the sacks with fresh pages and ensure there are pencils, crayons, toys, books in each one each week.

APPS: IT'S AN ONGOING CHAT





SKOUT is a location-based dating app and website. While users under 17 are unable to share private photos, kids can easily create an account using a different age.



INSTAGRAM is a photo/video sharing app. Profiles can be public, allowing anyone to see or comment. Teens can create fake accounts to hide content and use the messaging feature.



KIK allows anyone to contact and direct message your child. Kids can bypass traditional text messaging features. KIK gives users unlimited access to anyone, anywhere, anytime.



MEETME is a dating app that allows users to connect with people based on geographic proximity. As the app's name suggests, users are encouraged to meet each other in person.



AMONG US is a space-themed online multiplayer social game where players can message and chat with each other.



BEST SECRET FOLDER is specifically meant to hide photos and videos. It features password protection, decoy videos, and alarm settings.



CALCULATOR% is only one of several secret apps used to hide photos, videos, files, and browser history.







Meet Our New Missionaries: Josh & Alissa Crooks



Josh and Alissa Crooks have partnered with Teach Beyond to serve in Thailand with The Free Burma Rangers. The Free Burma Rangers is a movement of people, driven by compassion, who provide help, hope, and love to people of all faiths and ethnicities in conflict areas, to shine a light on the actions of oppressed and support leaders and organizations committed to liberty, justice, and service, all in the name of Jesus. They train teams of "rangers" to provide humanitarian relief in the form of medical care, shelter, clothing, human rights documentation, and outreach programs including songs, games, crafts, and testimonies of the love and hope found in Jesus.

Josh will be assisting and overseeing efforts to disseminate information to the global community about the suffering of millions of internally displaced individuals (IDP's) fleeing from the violence and brutality of the oppressive regime that grips Burma. Josh will do this through videos, podcasts, social media, and publications that tell the story of how the Gospel Light shines into the darkness. Publicizing these materials is secondary to Josh's main purpose: To not just tell the stories, but to actually bring the Gospel of Jesus to the oppressed with faith that He transforms hearts that have been shattered, reconcile enemies, and redeem entire communities. Josh will come alongside his colleagues as representatives of the hands and feet of Jesus through evangelistic and humanitarian activities. He will host outreach events, provide Bibles, supply medical aid, empower education, and distribute food and water. The family will be based in Thailand, and Josh will work at the Free Burma Ranger Head Quarters in Chiang Mai. As he is trained and equipped, there will be opportunities to cross into Burma and carry supplies and resources listed above.

Alissa's primary focus will be transitioning the family into their new home, new town, and new country. She will be present in their children's school, volunteering in their classroom and with sporting teams. Alissa dreams of finishing her coaching certification, joining the Free Burma Rangers in children and family outreach ministry, sharing the gospel and participating in humanitarian efforts, becoming a chaplain, and many more dreams. Lastly, she will be enrolling in a language school once they arrive in Chiang Mai.

The past year the Crooks family was located in Wheaton, IL as they debriefed, reflected, re-equipped, and re-launched into ministry now. They connected this past year with current partners as well as invited additional partners to strengthen their foundation of prayer and funding.

Please pray for the Crooks family as they move to Thailand and start their ministry with The Free Burma Rangers.
