Keyless Entry System Update

The new Keyless Entry System has been installed and activated. The front door has a reader along with intercom, camera, and a keypad. Entry doors by the gym and at the end of the children's wing have readers only.

Key fobs and cards are now available. For those who currently have a physical key to the building, you can return your key to the office during office hours and request either a key fob or card (your choice). In the month of July all exterior doors will be rekeyed and current physical keys will no longer work to open the

door(s).

VERY IMPORTANT: The marked door by the gym and at the end of the children's wing must remain unlocked. The crash bar must be pushed in. If these doors are locked from the inside, the key fob and cards will not work. This is the opposite of how the doors have operated over the years.

If you have any questions on this new procedure, please feel free to ask when

you exchange your physical key for he key fob or card.

There were two sisters that were about 2 years apart, that loved each other right from the start. Grandpa had told them that their dad had gone to heaven to be with Jesus, they loved and believed Grandpa so they accepted his simple explanation as the absolute truth without any arguments or fuss. Their mom and Grandpa took them to church every Sunday, Mom took Candy, the baby, to the nursery where she helped every week. And Grandpa took Cathy with him to listen to the pastor and the sermon he would speak. Cathy would listen very carefully and tried to remember questions and answers as she was to young to write them down, but she loved to stump Grandpa and turn his thoughtful face to a frown. At home Grandpa took care of Candy and Cathy so Mom could work 3 days a week, and Mom would lake care of them the other three days so Grandpa could work at the lumber yard by the creek. Their life had just settled down when Mom got a telephone call, Grandpa had taken a very bad fall.

From that time on, Grandpa stayed home because the lumber yard offered Mom a job in their office all week, Grandpa could hardly say "Thank you," as his eyes filled with tears, he could barely speak. At home Grandpa took care of Cathy and Candy full time, and he would tell the girls many stories. There were animal stories, fish stories, and Bible stories from a church that years ago he had taught. Their family room was full of thousands of pictures of animals or fish, and a picture of Grandpa and his dad with Grandpa holding up the biggest fish (the mounted fish was right beside the picture) he had ever caught!

Just before Christmas Mom came home from work looking very, very tired, so Grandpa knew she had been thinking about what they had talked about just before breakfast that morning. There was always the usual thoughts of what to buy the girls, but this year they had just noticed the roof over the attic and the girls room needed repairs. Grandpa went outside a few days ago and had taken the ladder and told Mom the whole roof needed new shingles otherwise it would be leaking all over upstairs. Grandpa told her they would all pray at the supper table, which they always did, and ask God what they could do. After supper an answer came so fast they could hardly believe it was true! Candy pointed and shouted "will-I, will-I, will-I" (Walleye) as that old fish came crashing to the floor. Thousands and thousands of dollars came spewing out, some even landing as far away as the front door! Grandpa was shocked as Mom and the girls as he remembered his dads words about that old "Walleye" fish: God will lead you back to your fish some day when HIS LOVE is really NEEDED, He knows YOUR LOVE for HIM is STRONG and deeply seeded!!!



Brierly and Mackenzie Kuhudzayi Zimbabwe, Africa



Brierly and Mackenzie Kuhudzayi live in Zimbabwe with their two daughters. They support the mission Made in Matobo, which works to improve the quality of life for people in southern Africa through agriculture.

Brierly, Mackenzie, and the girls had a wonderful trip to the U.S. this Spring. They feel it was a joy to spend Easter with Mackenzie's family in Michigan, as well as connect with friends and new ministry partners. The visits were full of encouragement, meaningful conversations, and opportunities to share the vision that God has placed on their hearts.

A big part of their trip was focused on fundraising-and they are thankful to report that they have reached their one-time giving goal for the next two quarters. Praise God!

In May they returned to Zimbabwe, and were excited to see the team thriving. At the farm base, they celebrated a successful first harvest of heirloom maize-an exciting step toward producing more sustainable feed for the animals and food for the community. Their first dairy calf was born while they were away, and fresh milk is now blessing both their family and team.

The chicken operation is doing great! Their most recent batch of 6,000 boilers finished very well, with low losses and solid weights-even in a tough market. Another batch is now in place.

They also installed a drip irrigation in the garden and micropasture-a huge step in conserving water and increasing efficiency.

The men's ministry and Bible studies are back in full swing. Brierly hosted a meaningful men's outreach meal and they were very encouraged when one young man prayed out loud to Jesus by name-a powerful moment there.

One of the most fun developments is their new mud hut guest room. It was built by local builders and ladies who are experienced at finishing mud huts and it is nearly done. The hut offers a unique and authentic space to host visitors.

<u>Prayer Requests:</u> With unreliable water and electricity, they have applied for a grant for solar power. Please pray that the application is accepted and process moves swiftly.

Pray over the construction of another chicken house in Ukuthula. They are working on a design using local materials and hope to build in a way that inspires community members to consider an enterprise of their own.

Mackenzie is pregnant and due in November! They had a healthy report at their 20 week scan, and continue to pray for a healthy second half of pregnancy.

They plan to host a small group of visitors from South Africa in August. They will be painting the exterior of their house and spend time encouraging one another in ministry. Pray for safe travels.

Please pray over the 6,000 chickens that will be placed at the Anglesea location and the team that takes care of them.
