

Church Produce Stand

The church produce stand is ready for the 2025 growing season near the north entrance on 142nd Avenue. If you have extra garden produce, please place it on the stand for others that are in need.



Can you give a bit of your time?

Is God calling you to get more involved in the ministry of the church? There are several opportunities where you can volunteer. Some of these ministries may take 15 minutes a week, others will require more time. Will you pray to see if God's speaking to you to serve Him in a new way?

Nursery Coordinator – while we don't have many children utilizing the nursery in recent weeks, the nursery needs to be staffed and ready for when children do come. This position involves creating a schedule for nursery workers, ensuring the toys and furniture are clean, and stocking the nursery with snacks/diapers, etc (which is reimbursable).

Children's Church Coordinator – Children's Church is for kids age 4 thru 2nd grade. This role involves creating a teacher/helper schedule for each week and seeing that curriculum and materials are available and ready.

Kids Activity Sacks – Sacks filled with coloring pages, small toys, and books are available at the Sanctuary main entrance for kids to take and enjoy during the service. Someone is needed to re-stock the sacks with fresh pages and ensure there are pencils, crayons, toys, books in each one each week.

THANK YOU to Rebecca Shanahan who has faithfully filled all 3 roles above and has done a marvelous job. Rebecca has asked to step down to focus more on her children and her job. If you see Rebecca, please thank her for the time she has given towards these ministries.

Wednesday Night ministries will be starting up in September. It is helpful to offer a meal on Wednesday nights for those bringing their kids or those attending Bible studies or praise team practice. We are looking for 4 or 5 people to plan and prepare meals for about 50 people and clean up afterward. Meals can be simple. For more information this ministry, see Valerie Lepeak.

Keyless Entry System Update

The new Keyless Entry System has been installed and activated. The front door has a reader along with intercom, camera, and a keypad. Entry doors by the gym and at the end of the children's wing have readers only.

Key fobs and cards are now available. For those who currently have a physical key to the building, you can return your key to the office during office hours and request either a key fob or card (your choice). In the month of July all exterior doors will be rekeyed and current physical keys will no longer work to open the door(s).

VERY IMPORTANT: The marked door by the gym and at the end of the children's wing must remain unlocked. The crash bar must be pushed in. If these doors are locked from the inside, the key fob and cards will not work. This is the opposite of how the doors have operated over the years.

If you have any questions on this new procedure, please feel free to ask when you exchange your physical key for he key fob or card.

Keyless Entry System Fundraiser Update

THANK YOU..... To all who have contributed towards the keyless entry system fundraiser. A deposit has been paid, the system has been installed and is functional. Installation was done now to avoid a price increase. The total cost of the project is \$10,605. As of July 24th, \$8,568.76 has been given. On top of that, there is \$965 available from undesignated memorial gifts, which when added to the amount donated so far, totals \$9,433.76. We are just \$1,071.24 away from the goal! Your generous contributions towards this project are greatly appreciated. Operation Christmas Child You are helping take the hope of the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

We praise God that this past November and December, over 11.9 million Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes were collected across the United States and seven other countries! Each prayerfully packed box was prepared for the journey to one of more than a hundred countries throughout the world.

Right now, over 80,000 ministry partners and volunteers are working alongside local churches, holding outreach events where children receive a gift-filled shoebox and hear the Good News of the Gospel. After each event, children are invited to participate in *The Greatest Journey* to learn more about developing their relationship with Jesus Christ.

We are also continuing Operation Christmas Child's mission to take the Gospel to the ends of the earth. In recent years, Samaritan's Purse has engaged more than 800 hard-to-reach groups in which most of the population has never before heard the Name of Jesus!

We saw a lot of joy and happiness as the children were receiving the gift of the love of God," said pastor Ramon Hernandez. "We are determined to take the Good News to the hearts of the people so they might know Christ and be saved."

Thousands of gift-filled shoeboxes are shared each day. With every child who receives a gift, another seed for the Gospel is planted. We ask that you join us in prayer that our ministry partners will be presented with more outreach opportunities, that we will successfully and safely deliver shoeboxes and discipleship materials into over a hundred countries, and that children and their families will be receptive to the Gospel, which will result in a bountiful harvest for God's Kingdom.

Items we are collecting this month include:

- yellow number 2 pencils
- zipper pencil pouches
- 24 count boxes of crayons
- color pencils
- kid scissors
- 6 inch rulers

We have already received plenty of cap erasers, large erasers, and pencil sharpeners.

There are different opportunities to help with crafts:

- Be sure to pick up a card or two at the Operation Christmas Child table and write a message to a child. Let's make sure all the shoeboxes have a card in them to let the children know of God's love and ours.
- Let Patty Hoekstra know if you are interested in braiding t-shirts into jump ropes.

Bibles for the World (BFTW) shares God's love in Jesus Christ to unreached peoples, the church, and Christian leaders in developing nations. While the Bible remains the most popular, most read book across the globe, more than 2 billion have never had the chance to read God's Word. BFTW provides Scripture in regions where there is little or no access to the Bible.

Bibles for the World focuses strongly on the spiritually vulnerable slice of the human race. The highest reason is the Great Commission: the fact that reaching an unreached world was our Lord's last and greatest imperative. One statistic states that only 2% of missions' spending is directed at reaching Unreached People Groups-the remaining 98% goes to evangelize cultures where the Gospel's light has already been illuminated. It's far more work and expense to identify and reach these harder-to-reach communities. Bibles for the World means the entire world-not the world most easily reached.

On a global scale, Bibles for the World is the founding member of The Alliance for the Unreached: a coalition of worldwide ministries sharing in BFTW commitment. Together, they promote an International Day for the Unreached as well as the "Third of Us" initiative: a movement to help Christians understand that while the Unreached People Group may seem remote and isolated, they actually compromise one-third of the world's population. Bibles for the World provides scriptures and network with local leaders and volunteers, and they keep their "ministry radar" ever searching for avenues to reach the Unreached. This has led them primarily to Asia and Southeast Asia, including Vietnam, Mongolia, and China.

Over time, they have discovered that reaching Unreached Groups are usually unreached for a clear reason: because of barriers either geographical, political, social, linguistic or cultural. But, they are developing strategies to overcome them. Prayer is the first step. Quietly, they have been working in Bhutan since 2006. One of the worlds most isolated and restricted Communistic countries, and now they have found local believers with a passion for reaching their nation's 140 plus people groups. When they entered Nepal, the entire country was considered Unreached. BFTW printed 3 million Gospels of John and created a network of 2,200 frontline workers-pastors, evangelists and missionaries. The

Nepalese church grew faster than any other Christian minority on earth.

All of these first-generation believers are on fire with passion for the Gospel. In many of

these countries, the spiritual passion is so fresh you feel like you're in the book of Acts. However, there are times, such as in Nepal, when the fear that Unreached communities are too sparse and isolated for meaningful evangelism. But, there is a greater story now that He is pouring out today.
