You can do just that on Tuesdays from 2:00-3:00 p.m. Pastor Dennis' office is open to anyone who would like to come in and talk. No appointment needed!





The last lady was so overwhelmed at how God works through a simple shoebox that she took a brochure and told me she would be in touch because she wants to help as well!

Update: I still have the opportunity to get soccer balls at \$5 each! We still need a few things to make the pencil pouches: zipper pencil cases, kids scissors, and 6 inch rulers. These can be bought in bulk on Amazon. Single subject notebooks can be found at Meijer, Target, and Walmart for 35 cents, but they are selling fast. Finally, kids silverware is needed. Ikea is a great place to purchase these. I also still need helpers to braid jump ropes!

Project Hope Dorr, Michigan



Project Hope is located in northeast Allegan county. Their goal is for people to experience Jesus Christ through love and hope, as they provide necessities for daily living. They also encourage people to take steps toward self sufficiency in order to realize their value as a unique individual created with purpose. The Project Hope facility includes a thrift store, food pantry, compassionate care program, and a community room. This year they are celebrating 27 years of serving in God's love. Many groups donate time and money to help Project Hope provide food and other daily essentials for people in need.

Project Hope is very thankful for the community and groups that have helped them throughout the year:

In May, Project Hope held a cereal drive. They are grateful to the community for donating 260 boxes of cereal and \$414 in monetary donations. This helped ensure children had breakfast throughout the summer.

On Saturday, May 10th they had the annual Letter Carriers Food Drive. The Dorr Post Office gathered an outstanding 2,154 pounds of food from the community. Project Hope is thankful for the community and post office workers for all their hard work through this event.

The Moline Christian 2nd Graders picked Project Hope as their class project. They learned how to bake with their parents, then sold the baked goods to raise money. In class they learned how to put together a balanced meal, then went to Leppinks to purchase the food items with the money raised from the bake sale. Finally, they visited Project Hope to learn about the community and donate the food they purchased. They donated a whopping 457 pounds of food!

A few needs met throughout the summer included: Corinth Reformed Church Quilting Circle donated lots of quilts, volunteers from Friendship CRC and Life Change Church worked on the gardens around the building, and Highpoint Community Bank deep cleaned the food pantry.

Project Hope is looking for volunteers in the following areas: cashiers, website design/ support, and garden maintenance.
